Background

- IMO Member States, intergovernmental organizations in cooperation with IMO and non-governmental organizations in consultative status with IMO were again invited to participate in the IMO-GMA scheme for the period 2024 to 2025 by identifying and nominating an "IMO Goodwill Maritime Ambassador" and submit the requisite nomination forms that were made available on the IMO website. The deadline for the receipt of nominations was 30 November 2023.
- 2 Upon the close of the nomination period, and after a review of the applications received, the thirty-five IMO Goodwill Maritime Ambassadors now represent twenty-three nominating authorities, currently seventeen Member States and six non-governmental organizations.

In July 2023, China celebrated its 19th "China Maritime Day" with extensive support from the Ministry of Transport and the China Association for Science and Technology. I led the organization of a week-long series of activities centered around the "China Maritime Forum," themed "Sailing for the New Maritime Silk Road, Heading Towards the Development Paradigm." The aim was to facilitate exchanges in the maritime sector, foster consensus for development, and deepen cooperation.

Throughout the week, we hosted various events such as the China Maritime Forum, Academic Conference, Science Popularization Week, Nautical Expo, and Maritime Culture Activity. These activities, involving over 230 institutions, set records in terms of scale, diversity, and participation.

In addition to the main forums, we organized specialized discussions on topics like ship technology, safety, seafarers, port development, dredging, sustainable ocean shipping, and maritime culture. These thematic forums engaged the industry, promoting a holistic approach to maritime fields.

The Nautical Expo showcased maritime technology achievements, drawing over 50,000 visitors. Main events were conducted both online and offline, with live-streamed press conferences and forums on multiple platforms. The launch of #ChinaMaritimeDay# on Weibo garnered over 100 million reads.

Promotion of the World Maritime theme, World Maritime Day, the International Day for Women in Maritime, the Day of the Seafarers online campaign and the IMO Award for Exceptional Bravery at Sea.

On September 7, I attended the scholarship award ceremony for the 2021-2022 academic year of the China Institute of Navigation—Zhang Rongfa Foundation. I encouraged maritime students to excel in their studies while also contributing to society. I urged them to grasp knowledge, think critically, and stay updated on technology trends. It's essential to engage in scientific research, uphold the spirit of science, and foster innovation. Additionally, I emphasized the importance of developing a broad perspective, cherishing cultural heritage, and promoting the maritime spirit of the new era. This spirit reflects the values of maritime practitioners and serves as a driving force for industry advancement. I urged students to embrace their role as inheritors of this spirit and contribute to the industry's high-quality development.

To deepen collaboration under the "Belt and Road" initiative, the China Institute of Navigation, along with 21 organizations, proposed joint efforts to promote international port and shipping technology cooperation.

In terms of academic exchange, a committee of 17 experts selected and published the top ten cases in intelligent shipping, while keynote speeches offered insights into navigational trends and future directions. The conference's live broadcast reached 110,000 viewers through various media platforms.

Additionally, the "Silk Road Maritime" International Cooperation Forum, established in 2018, has expanded to 317 member organizations, connecting 131 ports in 43 countries worldwide. Focused on infrastructure, rules, and cultural exchanges, the forum aims to advance international maritime cooperation.

I called for societal respect for seafarers' labor, care for their lives, and protection of their rights. The event was broadcast live to the public worldwide, with 120 participants in person and approximately 20,000 online participants.

 - On July 25, I attended the High-Quality Development Forum for Inland Waterway

July 25. Participated in "The Blue Humanities Leading the Way to Sustainability" round table event in the International Center for Human Sciences - UNESCO in partnership with Hanns Seidel Foundation and the Maritime Sciences and Technology Institute. In my intervention I

focused on how the empowerment of women positively impacts the overall work in the maritime sector, in addition to the requirements to update the laws and the administrative mechanization to strengthen this sector.

December. I had the opportunity to visit the Minister of Public Works along with the General Director of Land and Maritime Transport where we had the opportunity to discuss several issues concerning the maritime sectors nowadays, as well as the decisions following their meetings in the IMO.

October 31. Participatied in Co-Evolve conference in Tunisia, where I had the opportunity to meet the Minister of Public Works and Transport, the Minister of Agriculture and Water, and other Tunisian resources. The event fostered dynamic networking, strengthening partnerships for a sustainable Blue Mediterranean region, encouraging harmony between human activities and nature, ensuring a vibrant future for all. I had the opportunity to talk through MARPOL convention which includes regulations that aim at preventing ship pollution. In this event, our booth stood out whose aim was to introduce attendees to the captivating maritime life, as well as to highlight the diverse career opportunities withing this sector.

July 10 . Attending the first Arab-Hellenic Maritime Conference in Athens accompanied by the Lebanese Minister of Public Works and Transportation Dr. Ali Hamieh. This event was organized by the Arab-Hellenic Chamber of Commerce and Development, with the participation of ministers and ambassadors from around the globe, alongside more than a one hundred Arab and Greek companies specialized in transport. In my participation I have highlighted the importance of developmental integration between the Eastern and Western Mediterranean in the fields of maritime transportation as well as the importance of Lebanese ports in the maritime industry and the economics of maritime transport.

September 28. Participating in the IMO Good Will Maritime Ambassadors' annual meeting in IMO London and meeting the Secretary General Mr. Kitack Lim when I had the chance to convey the concerns and requirements of the Lebanese maritime sector, as well as ways to strengthen this sector and activating the role of the youth in it.

The IMO Goodwill Maritime Ambassador, in collaboration with NYK-TDG Maritime Academy, NTMA Alumni Societas Inc., and dedicated volunteer seafarers, executed a comprehensive series of Career Orientation Seminars across various provinces in the Philippines from September to December 2023. Aimed at inspiring and guiding youth towards a maritime career, the seminars covered a range of topics about the maritime industry. Active marine officers and engineers shared first-hand experiences during these discussions, providing valuable insights for the high school students. The campaign reached a total of 3308 students from different senior high schools, with the following breakdown from each location: 481 from Iloilo, 479 from Quezon, 423 from Oriental Mindoro, 379 from Camarines Norte, 635 from Mountain Province, 85 from Metro Manila, 707 combined from Ifugao and Nueva Vizcaya. This initiative aligns with the Ambassador's core mission of inspiring the younger generation to consider and pursue rewarding careers in the maritime sector.

Promotion of the World Maritime theme, World Maritime Day and Parallel Event, the International Day for Women in Maritime, the Day of the Seafarers online campaign and the IMO Award for Exceptional Bravery at Sea

The IMO-GMA has spearheaded an online campaign in promoting the World Maritime theme. Through online postings during the World Maritime Day, the Ambassador has shared insightful contents, engaging a global audience in discussions surrounding the maritime industry's importance and also important lessons in protecting the environment from pollution from ships.

Seafarers Dialogue and Dependents Assembly

In the second half of 2023, the IMO-GMA continued her advocacy for the seafaring profession through both on-site and virtual dialogues and assemblies. Held in Manila and across various provinces, these sessions updated on-vacation seafarers and families on industry

developments, safety measures, green shipping, etc. The on-site activities, with 140 seafarers and 340 dependents, and virtual dialogues with 500 seafarers covered critical subjects like on-board safety, behavior, mental health, and environmental protection. The Ambassador, aligning with UN SDGs, emphasized sustainability and highlighted the crucial role of seafarers and dependents in community programs. This outreach strategy underscores her commitment to diverse audiences, even in remote provinces, reinforcing the positive impact of the maritime industry on families and communities, and maintaining the Philippines as a leading seafarer-producing nation.

Seafarers and Dependents Christmas Party

The IMO-GMA and her team recently organized two Christmas Party Programs for seafarers and their dependents, drawing a participation of 300 dependents and 150 vacationing seafarers. This facilitated direct engagement and interaction between the seafarers, their families, and the Ambassador. Attendees had the privilege of hearing insights from the Ambassador about the maritime industry, fostering a sense of community. Moreover, these events provide an avenue for families to come together, promoting a stronger bond within the maritime profession. The parties also featured valuable discussions where senior officers and engineers shared first-hand experiences, offering guidance and insights into career paths, lessons learned, and advice for junior officers and engineers.

YWCA FFPI 97th Anniversary Celebration

The Young Women Christian Association Founder's Federation of the Philippines, Inc. (YWCAFFPI), a non-profit organization dedicated to women empowerment and youth development, celebrated its 97th Anniversary with the theme "Accountability, Sustainability, and Connectivity." Attended by 500 members, the event featured a candlelight ceremony, a Nativity Story presentation by YWCA members, and the induction of newly elected officers, including the IGM Ambassador. This significant partnership, spanning many years, has allowed the IGM Ambassador to reach a broad audience, providing orientation on job opportunities, livelihood, marine environment protection, and educational support to the youth in various provinces.

At least 5 IMO GMAs are participating in versions of the Adopt A Ship (AAS) program created by the Cyprus Shipping Chamber (CSC) in 2006. With blessing from the CSC, and collaboration from my fellow IMO GMAs, I created, manage and fund some versions of AAS www.adoptaship.org in the Philippines, India and the Pacific. My Teams and I could not have achieved our success with AAS without the collaboration from my fellow IMO GMAs. I travel the equivalent to more than 4 "round the world" trips every year to promote and effectively manage AAS. AAS is "Gender Neutral". AAS connects Maritime and Non-Maritime Communities. AAS promotes the IMO and Maritime Professional Careers, especially Seafaring. It consists of a senior Seafarer onboard exchanging an email with elementary school age children in a classroom, orphanage or shelter, via their teachers, once a week. track their ship on a world map that is provided for https://www.adoptaship.org/gallery/aas-launch-at-aages.aspx. They ask questions to Seafarers, via their teacher. AAS is flexible. AAS usually runs for 10 weeks. Most children are given pre & post tests/surveys. https://www.adoptaship.org/presentations-and-interviews/ Tests assess their international geography knowledge. Surveys assess their awareness of, and appreciation for, the Maritime Community prior to, and after, they participate in AAS. This objective data effectively documents dramatic increases. It can be a "stand alone" program or incorporated into existing programs. Most AAS participants are 10-12 years old, but that can vary. AAS helps participating countries to attract more boys and girls into Seafaring and other Maritime professions, by increasing Maritime awareness. Prior to 2017, no children were participating in AAS programs outside of Cyprus. We now have thousands of children participating in India and the Philippines. We adjusted AAS to include Orphanages and Shelters. We re-signed MOUs with our partners in the Philippines, and India, to resume their roles as AAS coordinators. PACWIMA are Coordinators in the Pacific. I fund and manage the AASI website, Facebook page and all AASI programs remotely and with in-person visits. We are also developing our new partnerships with India Maritime University and Port of Mumbai. They include AAS in outreach programs. In 2023 I met with a Superintendent of Schools in the Philippines. He requested we run AAS for all 20 of his Elementary Schools. I personally met with all principals, dozens of Teachers and hundreds of children. More than 16,000 Children in his Schools will participate AAS programs in https://www.adoptaship.org/Philippines/GeorgevisittoSchoolsDivisionOfficeofSanPedro.aspx He will recommend AAS to Superintendents in other areas of the Philippines. At his request, I agreed to also run AAS pilot programs for 13-15 and 16-18 years old Children in his District in 2024. I spoke about AAS with Children in India. We exhibited AASI at CrewConnect conference in Manila. AASI was discussed very favourably at the IMO-GMA meeting during WM week at the IMO HQ.

2 Promotion of the World Maritime theme, World Maritime Day, etc.

AAS International (AASI) is very closely aligned with some UN SDGs, IMO WMD annual Themes https://www.adoptaship.org/Brochures/Brochures.aspx in 2017, 2019, 2021, and IMO's current Gender Program; Women In Maritime. The 5 IMO-GMAs that already participate in AAS programs share all our AASI tools with our fellow IMO-GMAs, and others, in Africa and other areas. We are developing "formulas" that will allow others to calculate the approximate cost per Child in AAS programs. If AAS is given sufficient support, from the IMO, and others, it can help IMO-GMAs create programs related to Maritime into school curriculums globally. AAS strongly supports Women in Maritime, via "partnerships" with WISTA, IWSF, PACWIMA, and the Nautical Institute.

3 Other activities consistent with the IMO-GMA Terms of Reference.

Increasing awareness of, and appreciation for, the IMO and Maritime Community's contributions, is needed to help Seafarers become "essential workers" in all countries. That requires us to expand AAS to raise public awareness of the importance the IMO and Maritime community plays in the quality of life of everyone on the planet. AASI coordinates and builds "partnerships" with existing, and new AAS participants, around the world to more effectively achieve our common goal of having "Maritime" included in curriculums of all elementary schools globally, as it is currently in Cyprus and Laguna, Philippines. That will bring sustainability to AAS programs. In 2024 and 2025 we aspire to expand AAS in Asia, Europe and America and also introduce AAS into Africa. 5 IMO-GMAs are actively participating. We look forward to helping other IMO-GMAs begin in 2024. I'm in continual personal contact with shipping and crewing company senior executives with in-person and virtual visits to keep them aware of options for them to participate in AAS and AaSOS. We continually search for new partnerships and new target audiences to participate in AAS "globally". We try to educate them on the importance of Maritime and the critical role of the IMO. Effectively sharing that information will help inspire new generations of male and female Maritime Professionals. When I communicate with administrators, teachers, and children, I always advocate for Maritime professions in their nation.
